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In accordance with article 12, § 2, of the law of 29 May 1959 modifying certain dispositions of the education legislation and in compliance with the order of the Government of the French-speaking Community of 27 June 1994 concerning tuition fees in full-time higher education and in royal music conservatories, please find here below the tuition fees and the fees relating to the goods and services valued at their real cost, which constitute the registration fees to be applied for the academic year 2016-2017.

1. Registration fees.

The tuition fees for 2016-2017 and the maximum registration fees mentioned in the table here below are identical to those applied for the academic year 2015-2016.

In 2016-2017, there are no longer any additional fees, as foreseen by the above-mentioned article 12, § 2, subparagraph 5, of the law of 29 May 1959.

2. Modest income student.

(Order of the Government of the French-speaking Community, dated 25 May 2007)

In order to determine the status of the modest income student, we must first determine whether this student meets the conditions set to receive a study allowance from the services of the study allowances of the French-speaking Community (CF) in reference to the new Order of the Government of the CF of 21 September 2016 that determines the lower income condition of the candidates for a study allowance, as well as the criteria used to determine the amount of the study allowances (Belgian Official Gazette of 19 October 2016).

A student is considered to be of modest income when their taxable income cap is no more than € 3,494 above the amount allowing the grant of a student allowance, taking into account the number of dependent(s).

For the maximum income allowed in order to benefit from the status of modest income student, please refer to the table here-below (columns (1) and (3)) for academic year 2016-2017:
